PARTICULARS OF ORGANIZATION, FUNCTIONS AND DUTIES

1. Aims and Objectives of the organization :

Acharya Narendra Dev College has a unique distinction of being the only college that is primarily for science. It is named after the great educationist and reformist of Modern India; Acharya Narendra Dev. Over the years, it has acquired repute for the meritorious profile of its student population, their sense of discipline and social responsibility.

2. Mission/Vision:

Acharya Narendra Dev College endeavors to nurture students with a keen analytical and scientific bent of mind with sensitivity to their responsibilities and human values so that they are amongst the best citizens of India.

3. Brief History and background for its establishment:

It was in early 1991 that Mr. Chandra Shekhar, the then Prime Minister of India, announced the establishment of Acharya Narendra Dev College. As a new constituent college of the University of Delhi established by Delhi Administration, it generated a great deal of enthusiasm amongst the localities. Then, starting out with an interim allotment of four rooms in a SPS structure in R. K. Puram Sector 5 School, the college enrolled its first batch of students and began its teaching programs. In August 1992, the college moved to its current premises in Govindpuri, Kalkaji, which had just been vacated by Shaheed Bhagat Singh College. Despite being housed in an old school building, the college very soon established its reputation as a premier science college of the University of Delhi. Building the institution has been a labor of love, be it the Principals, the young faculty and support staff and, most importantly, the students who have passed through the portals of the institution.

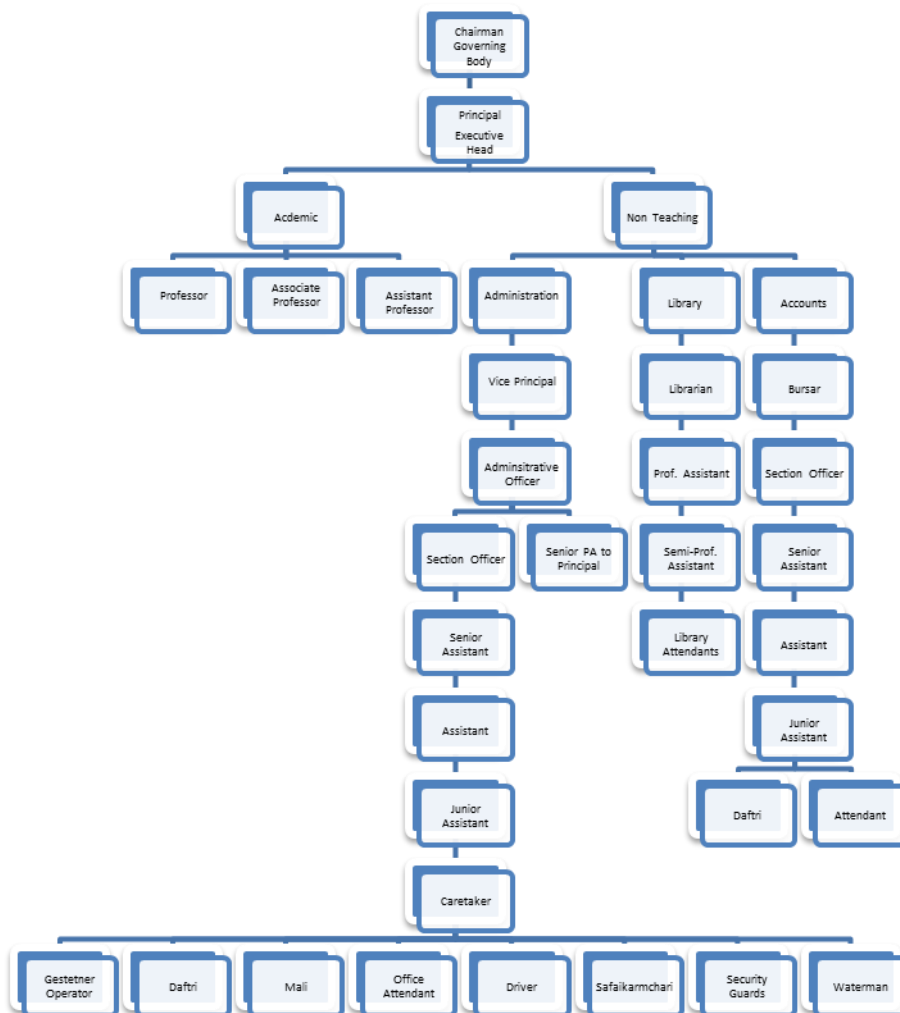
5% seats of total intake are available (supernumerary) for PwD as per University of Delhi rules.

5. Allocation of Business :

- Decision making by College Governing Body, Principal and Staff Council
- Administrative work by the administrative staff
- Teaching, extracurricular and co-curricular activities by the faculty and students in collaboration with the non teaching staff.

6. Duties to be performed to achieve the mission:

Ever since the establishment of college in 1991, the college has been playing a significant role in imparting education in science and commerce In order to achieve its objectives and vision the college has formulated various schemes/activities, which are broadly categorized in the following manner :

- a. Organization of curricular activities and innovations. The College has introduced new courses like B.Sc Honors Biomedical Sciences and B.Sc. General Sericulture (now B.Sc. Life Sciences) for the first time in the Delhi University curriculum.
- b. Organization of different creative programs.
- c. Encouragement to students to get an exposure at local, zonal and state level events.
- d. Representation of students in different inter college programs
- e. Teacher's participation in various educational seminars, workshops and conferences.
- f. By encouraging the non teaching staff to participate in various intra and inter-college competitions.

7. Details of Service Rendered:

- a. Students are advised to go to various institutions for their growth through the co-curricular activities.
- b. Teachers and students take part in Seminars/Symposia/Workshops to enhance their knowledge.
- c. Teachers are allowed to go on study leave in order to promote their career.
- d. A few teachers have done research work and published their books.
- e. Encouragement to needy students by providing free-ships by way of giving them scholarships and grants through the vice-chancellor's student's fund of the University.
- f. Students are encouraged to participate in cultural programs, quiz, debates, theatre poster competitions and sports competitions etc.

8. Service/grant

The college encourages the undergraduate students to take up research projects under the mentorship of college teachers under ELITE Scheme.

The departments are granted funds for taking up ELITE projects with UG students.

The UG/Ph.D. students are promoted to participate in the conferences/Symposium for presenting their research work and promote learning.

The teachers are encouraged to participate in FDP/ conferences/Symposium for updating their knowledge and skill in various areas of teaching and learning.

The non-NET Ph.D. students are provided financial assistance to complete their research work.
