FROM OUR CONVENOR







The workshop had the following events :-

1. Reading and signing of consent form of participation.

2. Introduction of all the participating students and organising team.

3. Fly to the moon activity, in which students imagine going to the moon from earth. The purpose of the activity was to know the imagination capability of the students.

4. Principles of co-designing solutions to combat gender violence.

5. Yes and...., activity was performed in group of two. The purpose of this activity was to respect each others views and opinions.

6. Design task #1 :- Students were divided into two groups and a situation of gender violence was given to each group. Then a discussion was held to give solutions about what would the person do as a victim and a bystander, covering following concerns-

- Lack of awareness about non-physical forms of violence.
- Lack of confidence.
- Concern about society opinions.

7. Design task #2:- Four ideas were presented, two to each group, on how to spread awareness on gender violence and motivate people to share their stories. Students were asked to write what they like about the idea, what they wish to improve, what they wonder about and what they want to remove, about both the ideas given to their group.

8. A discussion was held when all the ideas given by students were summarised, about how to spread awareness to youth through social media and how that content can be made appealing to the people.

- 9. An answering session to five W's:-
- WHAT what should be the ideas?
- WHY why people should be aware about this?
- WHO who should be aware?
- WHEN when is the best time to spread awareness?
- WHERE where should we spread the awareness?





TRANSGENDER AND #METOO MOVEMENT IN TERMS OF GENDER PARITY

'Feminism is not anti men but it is equality and inclusiveness for all'

Gender Parity is a statistical measure and if we consider it deeply it goes in a very scientific manner that is used to describe ratios in men and women or boys in girls in a given population. Gender parity is one of the theories of feminism only since it has domains like education, STEM, Workforce and many other and it helps us to determine that is the country or the state working in terms of equality or not, if not which practices are required to ensure the same, how much empowerment is still needed, are the goals been accomplished or not. These are the questions which are posed on Gender Parity. But if we look closer in terms of gender parity it is often used interchangeably with gender equality and if we see more through the sociological perspective it looks like a binary distinction of gender identity. But living in the era of 2023 do we really have a binary distinction in terms of gender identity. Where Delhi has witnessed its 11th Queer Pride parade in the month of January this year which was celebrated with huge pomp and show, I suppose that this statement is supposed to be a little hypocritical. We the generation often regarded as 'gen-z' use pronouns like HE/HIM, THEY/THEM to support our fellow friends and then if we revolve our discussion to just the 'binary distinction' of male and female, I suppose it won't look fair.

Being Transgender at Work

Accepting oneself, breaking the monotony takes courage and that's why gender sensitization is the need of the hour. In the initial stages finding a job is the biggest task for them. Abina Aher is a trangender activist and an associate director of an organisation named TWEET -Transgender Welfare, Equity and Empowerment Trust. While describing her challenges in Josh talks she stated - 'She was forced into begging and due to circumstances had to get indulged as a sex worker in order to sustain her life but after a time when she decided to take up a job and have a stable life. She went to the interviews and the recruiter looking at her physical and sexual orientation often rejected her despite her having skills in that particular field and after a lot of struggle she found a job that brought her stability. After moving from this if a transgender individual gets and lands up into a job then being judged, bullied, hearing slangs like 'aee chakka, aee mamu' has to be heard and in addition with that HARRASMENT which can come in any form maybe less salary, verbal, physical or sexual harassment.

#METOO MOVEMENT

The #metoo movement has garnered a lot of attention in the west and then in India as well but have we ever heard of any #metoo movement in Transgenders. This is due to the very reason for this only because if they ever think of raising their voice, standing up for their dignity against any sort of harassment in return getting fired from the job, humiliation and social boycott is the reward which they get. Bhanwari Devi an activist in her 60's was gang raped by some men of upper castes when she was stopping a child marriage in front of her husband to which now we see in workplaces is Vishakha Guidelines to safeguard women against harassment. But in cases like these also something must have to be done.

CONCLUSION-

Begging, sex work is not included in GDP, income tax is not charged then how we can know that how many acually are working. And if such a workplace environment is full of gender discrimination then quitting the job seems much easier than doing one. Gender parity at a good level can only be achieved when everyone is respected, valued and feels safe while working. It's not that if we don't talk about harassment in males it doesn't exist or men don't suffer. In terms of Transgender if we say, if an individual has to go through such a rigorous process that is first accepting themself, then making people accept them, getting included in the society (in satire even if it has to go through the way of harassment), then fight for job, fight for equitable salary, respect and a life filled with dignity which doesn't even need to be asked but is the very much right of every individual then I quess it's not progressive but it's regressive. Let's not be a society which contributes to the trauma but a society which walks the path of unity in diversity in real terms, is really kind and instead contributes in healing. Achieving a good gender parity is a cake walk but including everyone in the race of gender parity is surely not and we will strive harder to achieve this goal as well.

"Let's care for humanity, Not for person's colour. Appreciate achievement, Not gender. Cherish humanrelations, Not the cast they belong."


